

**Wilbur Henry
'Bill' Dammeier**

Sept. 12, 1914

— March 23, 2002

Sequim resident Wilbur Henry "Bill" Dammeier died in Olympic Medical Center, Port Angeles. He was 87.

He was born to William Henry and Lucy (Fuhrman) Dammeier in Tacoma, where he graduated from Stadium High School and worked in his brother's print shop as a salesman.

From January 1942 until November 1944, he served on a Navy destroyer escort in the Atlantic and, at discharge, was a second class petty officer yeoman's mate.

In 1947, Mr. Dammeier started working as a furniture factory representative and, on July 2, married Odolite Evonne "Oda" Tharp, in Tacoma.

The Dammeiers relocated to Boise, Idaho, where he traveled Oregon and Idaho routes before transferring to Salt Lake City, Utah, in 1951.

Mr. Dammeier was a senior warden of the Episcopal Church.

After moving to Bountiful, Utah, he became Worthy

Patron of Eastern Star and Master of the Masonic Lodge.

After retiring to Sequim in 1979, Mr. Dammeier was active at St. Luke's Episcopal Church, the Masonic Lodge and Rhododendron Grange, as well as being a Museum and Arts Center volunteer. In both Boise, Idaho, and Carlsborg, he belonged to Disabled American Veterans.

He is survived by his wife of 54 years. His brothers — Fuhrman, Laurence and Leonard Dammeier — and sister Carol Satterlee preceded him in death.
