

**Garnett Joseph Watters**

**Oct. 26, 1919 — May 27, 2003**

Sequim resident Garnett Joseph Watters died at age 83.

He was born in Young, Saskatchewan, to Garnett E. and Florence (Fleener) Watters.

He married Doris Barton in Seattle on Oct. 19, 1946.

Mr. Watters helped make B-52 bombers with the Boeing Co. for seven years, then worked at 3M as a sales supervisor for 38 years before retiring in 1979 and moving to Sequim.

He was a private pilot and a volunteer fireman for Diamond Point, serving as department chief for much of his 15 years of service.

Mr. Watters, who was a 17-year member of Rhododendron Grange, also belonged to St. Luke's Episcopal Church, Elks Club and Civil Air Patrol.

Survivors include his wife; sons Don of Jacksonville, N.C., and Larry of Waldorf, Md.; six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by son Rick.
