Stewart E. Westcott

A memorial service for Stewart E. Westcott will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday, March 30, 1996, at Sequim Valley Chapel. The Rev. John Morgan will officiate. Mr. Westcott will be buried with full military honors at Sequim View Cemetery. Mr.

Westcott died Feb. 26, 1996, in San Antonio, Texas. He was 71.

Mr. Westcott was born July 2, 1924, in Oxford, N.Y. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and later joined the Air Force Reserve from which he retired as a lieutenant colonel. He also worked for the Division of Highways in

California. He retired from the Boeing Co. in 1987.

Mr. Westcott was a pilot and made many trips around the country with his wife. They also made several trips to Australia. One of his retirement projects was building a Glasair airplane, which was completed in 1994. They flew the plane to the experimental aircraft association convention in Lakeland, Fla., in 1995.

Mr. Westcott was a member of the local chapter of the experimental aircraft association; the Aircraft Owners and Pilot Association, Washington Pilots Association, OX-5 Club, Rhododendron Grange and the Society of Stukely Westcott descendants of American.

In addition to Merle Ann, his wife of 48 years, at the family home, Mr. Westcott is survived by three children Lewis Westcott of Issaquah, Susan Campbell of Snohomish and Laureen Pomeroy of Colbert; brothers Lewis, John, Paul, Robert, David and Byron; a sister Grace Drennen and seven grandchildren.
